SENIOR SUBJECTS

That's why our senior homeschool program offers a wide range of subject choices designed to foster both academic excellence and personal growth.

Students must complete English as a core subject and then have the flexibility to select five additional subjects from a diverse range of options.

This flexibility allows students to explore their interests, develop essential skills, and tailor their education to align with their future goals.



English (Compulsory): This subject focuses on developing critical reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills. Students will analyse texts, explore different genres, and engage in creative and persuasive writing, all while building strong communication and analytical abilities.



Mathematics – Advanced: This course covers advanced mathematical concepts, including algebra, calculus, and statistics. It is designed for students planning to pursue further studies in fields such as engineering, sciences, and technology.

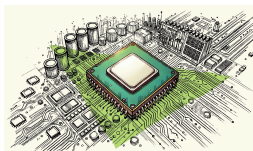

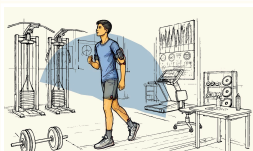

EUKA'S APPROACH TO STUDENT ASSESSMENT

At Euka, we are dedicated to providing a flexible, student-centred approach to learning that caters to the unique needs of Australian homeschoolers. As universities move away from traditional timed exams, we've developed a similar assessment model that **prioritises mastery of subjects over formal exams**. Our approach allows students to work at their own pace, **free from the pressure of timed assessments**.

We offer a wide variety of assessments designed to suit different learning styles, including written papers, open-book self-paced tests, project-based assessments, and portfolios. This diversity gives students the chance to demonstrate their knowledge and skills in ways that best reflect their strengths.

Our role goes beyond simply marking assessments. We focus on continuous learning, providing students with a supportive environment where they can grow and improve. When a student submits an assessment, they receive a preliminary mark and detailed feedback from their teacher. This feedback highlights strengths and areas for improvement, allowing students to refine their work and resubmit for further evaluation. The goal is not just to complete the assessment but to deepen their understanding of the material.

All assessments are completed at the students own pace, with no strict deadlines, allowing students to upload their work when they feel ready. Euka teachers provide UPC students with prompt and constructive feedback through the Student Portal, helping students develop their skills. This ensures that the assessment process is a meaningful learning experience rather than simply a grading exercise.

For students enrolled in the assessment-free program, we provide the same assessments, along with the marking rubric used by teachers. This enables assessment-free students and their parents to self-evaluate their work, giving them insight into how they can improve and continue their learning journey. This approach encourages self-reflection and personal growth, ensuring that all students benefit from the learning process.

Euka's approach to assessment focuses on fostering growth, development, and true mastery of the subject, rather than simply assigning grades.

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF ALEX:

A Grade 12 Assessed / University Pathway Euka student

One of the best parts of learning with Euka is how I can structure my day around my future goals and work schedule. I'm working part-time at a local gym and plan to study a Bachelor of Medical Science at university after homeschooling in Grade 12, so balancing my time is important to me.

- **6:30 AM** - I start my day early with a quick workout before breakfast—it's part of my routine since I work at a gym and love staying active. Afterward, I jump straight into my studies. Today, I'm focusing on my English assignment, which is essential for my future studies. I log into the Euka portal, check the assignment requirements, and spend a couple of hours working on it.
- **9:00 AM** - After a solid study session, I take a short break to refuel. I grab a healthy snack and head back to my next task—Chemistry. Since this subject ties directly into my future university plans, I'm dedicated to keeping up with it. I work through some practice problems and review the key concepts I'll need for an upcoming assessment.
- **11:00 AM** - I check my progress in the Euka portal to make sure I'm on track with my weekly tasks. I've got a good rhythm going, so I'm feeling confident about the workload. Next, I focus on Biology, which is one of my favourite subjects because it's closely related to medical science. I love diving deeper into topics that will help me in my future career.
- **12:30 PM** - I take a break for lunch before heading off to my part-time job at the local gym. Working there keeps me motivated and active, and it's a great balance with my studies. Since I have the flexibility to study around my shifts, I can make sure I'm staying on top of everything.
- **4:30 PM** - After finishing my shift at the gym, I come home and spend another hour on schoolwork. I'm preparing for an important assessment, so I go over my notes for Biology.
- **6:00 PM** - With my study goals for the day accomplished, I review what's left for the week using the Euka portal. I like knowing I'm ahead of schedule and managing both work and study effectively. With working a full day tomorrow, I can relax for the evening, feeling confident in my progress and excited about my plans for the future.

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF MAX

A Grade 12 Assessment-Free Pathway Euka student

The Assessment-Free Pathway with Euka gives me the freedom to focus on learning at my own pace and explore my entrepreneurial dreams. I'm currently working on a product for my Grade 12 Business course and planning to move into a Cert III in Business at TAFE after Grade 12. I also make time for my hobbies like mountain biking and basketball.

- **9:00 AM** - I start my day by heading out for a morning ride on my mountain bike. I love starting the day outdoors—it helps me clear my mind and come up with new ideas for my business project. After about an hour of riding, I grab some breakfast and get ready for the rest of the day.
- **10:30 AM** - I log into the Euka portal to check my tasks for the day. Since I'm in the Assessment-Free program, I don't have submissions, but the assessments keep me on track and the included marking rubric allows a clear gauge of my progress. Today, I'm focusing on my Business course. I'm in the process of creating a product as part of my project, and I spend the morning working on the design and brainstorming marketing strategies. One day, I want to run my own business, so I'm putting a lot of effort into this project.
- **12:00 PM** - I take a break for lunch and use this time to sketch some ideas for my business project. I'm working on the packaging and branding for my product, and spending this creative time brainstorming helps me come up with new concepts that I can develop later. It's a great way to recharge while still making progress on my goals.
- **1:00 PM** - Back to work on my business project. I spend the afternoon researching competitors and thinking about how to position my product in the market. This hands-on experience is exciting because it feels like I'm already starting my journey as an entrepreneur. The Assessment-Free program gives me flexibility, so I'm able to dive deep into what interests me most, without the pressure of submission.
- **3:00 PM** - I shift focus to another subject—Maths. Although it's part of my program, I'm also thinking about how the financial skills I'm learning will help me manage my future business. I spend some time working through real-life examples, like budgeting for my product or calculating profits.
- **4:00 PM** - With my studies done for the day, I check my progress in the Euka portal and set my goals for tomorrow. I feel good about the work I've accomplished, and I'm on track with my business project. I also leave time for creativity—this is when some of my best ideas come to life.

- **5:00 PM** - I finish off the day with a basketball session at the local court, connecting with friends.
- **7:00 PM** - After dinner, I spend some time researching business trends and successful entrepreneurs. I find their stories inspiring, and they keep me motivated to keep building my own path.

SCHOOLS out for more than just summer for Sydney sisters Natalia, Isabel and Juliette Benitez, who are among a rising cohort of "de-liberate homeschoolers".

Traditionally homeschooling in Australia was for those kids who didn't fit into the mainstream schooling system – dubbed "accidental homeschoolers" – but it's no longer the domain of the disengaged according to one provider.

Euka Future Learning experienced a 170 per cent increase in student numbers in 2022 compared to last year, and applications are now flooding in for 2023.

Homeschooling registrations across all providers in NSW rose from just under 5000 in 2017 to almost 9000 in 2021. Many got a taste of homeschooling during Covid and liked it, said Euka CEO

Jarryd Van Poppel.

"For many years, we've seen students leave mainstream schooling because they have learning challenges, or due to bullying, and that's still the reason for many," he said.

"However more recently we've seen parents and carers move children to homeschooling not because they're unhappy with the mainstream system but because they want more freedom and flexibility than a 9 to 3 school day can provide. They may be working remotely, travelling, or their children may be musically or athletically talented and need time for practice.

"Many also saw the improvement in their children when they were removed from the inevitable distractions of a classroom."

The Benitez sisters from Casula have experienced both classroom and home schooling, and for Natalia, 16, who is finishing Year 10 via

Euka, there's a clear winner.

"Home schooling prepares me for further education as it requires me to be responsible and independent to ensure assessments are completed to a high standard," she said.

"A lot of people make assumptions about homeschoolers – that they're not able to communicate with their peers because they're not at school. But I've found I have made better friendships, and more friendships, now than at school through extra-curricular activities."

Their mum, and teacher, Amanda Symonds-Poynton said when Natalia was in Year 5 she experienced bullying, and struggled with her learning, so she left her job and set up at home with support from Euka.

There was guidance on how to assess her daughters' education levels, how to implement the curriculum, detailed lesson plans and ideas for activities and excursions.

learning was becoming increasingly popular with more mainstream students because it offered flexibility for parents and students in the wake of the pandemic.

"They're no longer tied to the regimented structure of the 9-3 school day and can plan whatever extra-curricular activities they like," he said. "Covid-19 and the forced shutdown of schools gave families a taste of home-schooling and it would seem as if they liked it, despite the situation in which it was thrust upon them."

Figures from the Home Education Network show that just 10,000 Australian children were homeschooled a decade ago. That figure sat at about 27,000 last year.

Victoria recorded one of the largest surges in home learning in that time, second only to NSW.

Euka founder Ellen Brown said home learning allowed students with particular interests or paths to professional

careers to tailor their schedules to other commitments without missing important lesson content.

"A child could be thriving in the mainstream school system in 2022 but their parents might still opt to homeschool them to give them their best shot at going on to a professional career in music or sports or E-sports," she said. "It just allows them to invest their precious time and energy into endeavours they believe will serve them best in adult life."

Hampton Park mother Ayesha Khan began homeschooling her son, Mohammad Haseeb, 13, in term two this year with Euka curriculum so he could dedicate more time to his religious studies.

She said Mohammad at times missed learning alongside his friends at his former school, but remote learning

allowed him to study at his own pace, and he now catches up with his friends outside of school. "He can now study civics and citizenship, which he couldn't do at his old school," she said.

"There are no specific deadlines and if you don't understand something, you can dedicate more time to it and work it all I suppose him for science, maths and English, and we set up our own timetable for the day."

Under Victorian regulations, children must attend mainstream school until their guardian's registration is approved.

Parents must submit a learning plan to the state regulator, which outlines how they will cover the key learning areas: English, maths, science, humanities and social sciences, the arts, languages, health and physical education, information and communication technology and design and technology.

The VQA refused just 10 homeschooling applications this year.

Thomas sat the Australian Mensa IQ test in August 2022 which found he had an IQ of 147 at the age of 13.
