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## WHAT'S NEXT

# There's no one path. There's a path that fits your child.

By the time your child is finishing school, the world has more doors than it had when you were that age. Some lead to university, some to TAFE, some to work, some to starting their own thing. The job in these final years is to know what's available and choose deliberately.

## THE MAIN ROUTES AFTER SCHOOL

**University.** Direct entry via traditional ATAR, or via alternative pathways including Euka's University Pathway and 80+ partner institutions.

**TAFE and vocational training.** Practical, industry-aligned qualifications. Often the fastest route to skilled employment.

**Workforce.** Apprenticeships, traineeships, or direct employment in industries that value capability over credentials.

**Self-directed paths.** Creative, entrepreneurial, or unconventional routes that suit independent young people.

## MANY DOORS OPEN

# Pathways to university, TAFE, employment, and alternative options.

Senior years are a fork in the road, but a forgiving one. The decision can shift along the way. Knowing the options early just makes the eventual choice easier.

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**University Pathway.** For students planning higher education. Teacher-marked assignments with detailed feedback, an Academic Transcript, and access to Euka's 80+ university and college partner pathways. No ATAR required.

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**Assessment-Free Pathway.** For students heading to TAFE, apprenticeships, work, or alternative directions. Same senior curriculum, self-assessed using rubrics, completed with a Grade 12 Completion Certificate.

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**TAFE direct.** Many TAFE courses don't require Year 12 completion. A pathway can be opened earlier than people think.

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**The choice is in Year 10 or 11.** You don't need to choose now.

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## RETURNING, IF YOU CHOOSE

# Re-entering mainstream education if desired.

Homeschooling isn't a one-way door. Many students move back into mainstream school for senior years, for a specific course, or because their needs change. It's a regular, planned transition, not a failure.

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**Plan ahead.** Schools want enrolment documentation and progress records. Both can be ready when you need them.

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**Standard Reporting and Academic Transcripts.** Built into Euka, downloadable from the Parent Portal whenever you need them.

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**Premium Reporting if you need more.** Government-compliant documentation for schools that want it.

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**The transition itself.** Most schools accept homeschooled students readily, especially with clear documentation.

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## BEYOND THE MARKS

# Measuring success beyond formal results.

By the time your child finishes school, marks matter less than the person they've become. The most useful measure isn't a number; it's whether they're prepared for what's next.

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**Can they think for themselves?** Independent reasoning, not just remembered answers.

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**Can they communicate?** Verbally, in writing, with strangers as well as family.

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**Can they keep going when something is hard?** Resilience matters more than aptitude.

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**Do they know what they want?** Self-knowledge is the foundation of every good decision they'll make.

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## LIFE BEYOND SCHOOL

# Building life skills, independence, resilience, and confidence.

School teaches subjects. Life teaches subjects plus everything else. Homeschooling is uniquely placed to teach both, because real-world skills can be woven into the day rather than added on the side.

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**Money.** Budgets, banking, taxes, costs. Real numbers, real consequences.

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**Cooking, cleaning, maintenance.** The household runs because someone runs it. Let that someone be them sometimes.

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**Communication and conflict.** Family is the practice ground for the rest of life.

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**Decision-making.** Small decisions now, bigger ones later. The muscle is built by use.

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## READY

# Preparing for adulthood.

The last years of school are the last years your child is fully in your house. The goal isn't to extend childhood; it's to ease the handover to adulthood with confidence on both sides.

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**Give them ownership of their day.** They wake themselves, plan themselves, finish themselves. You're a coach, not a manager.

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**Let them fail safely.** A missed deadline at 16 teaches more than a perfect record. Real stakes, recoverable ones.

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**Talk about what's coming.** Money, relationships, work, mental health, big decisions. Cover the topics before they're tested by life.

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**Trust the work you've done.** The values, habits, and capability you've built together are already part of who they are.
